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Bob Scowcroft, Secretary

Bob has successfully transitioned from a "retirement" state of mind into a more active composition of consultant, volunteer and advocacy oriented activities. He currently serves on the Board of Directors of the Nell Newman Foundation and sits on three non-profit advisory boards. He previously served as Executive Director of the Organic Farming Research Foundation, a national organization, based in Santa Cruz, California. It was cofounded by Bob and two certified organic farmers in 1990. In the nearly 20 years Bob directed OFRF, it awarded over \$2,400,000 in support of over 320 organic research and education projects. The results of which were shared with over 15,000 organic farmers and ranchers throughout North America. During Bob's tenure OFRF had an active policy, research, and publishing program, and it disseminated information on all sectors of the organic product industry to the public at large. Bob averaged 200 media interviews and over 15 conference presentations on all subjects "organic" annually. He sat on five NonGovernmental Organizations (NGO) Advisory Boards. He resigned and retired from OFRF at the end of 2010. Prior to working for OFRF, he was the first full time Executive Director of California Certified Organic Farmers (1987-1992); before that he served in the Friends of the Earth's San Francisco office as their national organizer with a primary focus on pesticide reduction and organic farming advocacy (1979-1985).

James cast wide into subjects that improve what we

eat, where we live and how we interact with nature. Years before it was in vogue, James pioneered green, sustainable techniques and materials for manufacturing including developing the use of organic cotton and organic hemp and

linen from the ground up - crops otherwise notorious for high pesticide use. TerraPax, Inc., a company he established in 1992, manufactures fashionable carrying bags from only natural, sustainable material – a company with zero waste from manufacturing is an oft-copied model for authentic ecological brands. James sold the international entity after ten successful years. James is currently president of Green in the Black, a strategic planning company guiding emerging brands through the green market landscape. Providing strategy, content, design, engineering, and marketing -Green in the Black makes the sustainable obtainable and profitable. He is also the CEO of MethodSeven, bringing advanced optics to the hydroponic industry. He is on the advisory board of the Western Environmental Law Center, which has been defending the American West since 1976 with a team of brilliant attorneys and strategy. James also recently joined and the advisory board for Atria Systems, which is developing and marketing fire suppression chemicals which are safe both for the natural and human environment. James received a B.A. in Human Ecology from the College of the Atlantic.

The Nell Newman Foundation is a private foundation dedicated to humanitarian, scientific and environmental action that foster a resilient and restorative planetary ecology.


